Hello from Jean, your new Regional Trustee



In this newsletter I'd like to celebrate the achievements of u3as across the Region, and let us share things that will help u3a groups to thrive. Our expert editorial team, John and Margaret Aston, have agreed to create a quarterly newsletter, while I can email info if it's urgent. However, as I'm new to the u3a Trustee role, I'd also like to take this opportunity to introduce myself.

I began my career as a teacher of English, and retrained to become one of IBM's first female computer salesmen. After that I spent many years working both in education and IT, e.g. as head of marketing & comms for a start-up that provided technology for schools. In my last role before

retirement, I was part of the team that set up the digital training academy for Rolls-Royce, so I have plenty of experience relevant to u3a. I'm also a Trustee for the International Longevity Centre UK, which highlights the issues presented by an ageing population.

Locally, I belong to Lichfield u3a and was a committee member for some years, responsible for publicity and for booking speakers. I'm still part of its Art, Art Appreciation, and German Language groups. Their Art group has had to raise its fees from 50p to £2 per session to cover hall hire, but it's still a bargain, which is one of the many things I appreciate about u3a.

I was a member of Allan Walmsley's Regional team and hope that you'll consider joining the new Regional Team; they let me know what's going on in the Region and plan Region-wide events. In August I'm going to the North-West Region's Summer School in Carlisle; if we can form an active Regional team, we could run a similar event locally next year. GRANTS AVAILABLE TO u3as in 2023

The Third Age Trust offers grants to u3as, networks or other groupings of u3as to help to raise the profile of the u3a movement. The u3a should submit the relevant application to the Regional Trustee via email, confirming this is the only grant they are applying for in this financial year. All grants need to be approved by the Regional Trustee prior to the activity taking place. Payment of the grant will not be made more than 12 weeks in advance of the event.

Types of grant:

Start up grants (£300 maximum): for new u3as during their set-up process. Contact Linda Hodson at Linda@u3a.org.uk.

Relaunch grants (£100 fixed amount): This is to cover disbursements made on a relaunch. However, a u3a should not apply for a relaunch grant if it has sufficient reserves to cover the costs of a relaunch. The intention is that the grants will apply to those u3as whose membership numbers have fallen away significantly (by more than 20% in a year). *Relaunch grant application form August 2021 (583.74 KB)*

Special events grants (£150 maximum): to support events aimed at raising awareness of & recruiting new members.

Special Event grant application form May 2022 (568.35 KB)

Workshop, exhibition, festival grants (£500 maximum): to assist with the organisation of workshops/exhibitions/seminars/festivals or similar on topics relevant to the running and future development of u3as or recruitment. Activities must normally involve networks or groups of u3as. The grant may, for example, be to cover the cost of taking a stand/exhibition space at a local or country show or similar events or the travel expenses of trainers or guest presenters. It may also be used to support members on national activities designed to raise the profile of the movement. In all cases, however, there must be a clear indication of how this will raise the profile of the u3a movement and enable recruitment. *Workshop grant application form August 2021 (583.58 KB)*

Large national grant (£5,000 maximum): a new grant being trialled during the 2023/24 financial year, to enable u3as (or groups of u3as) to have a presence at events that attract a large national audience with a significant number of visitors in the u3a demographic. The u3a, network or region coordinating u3a involvement must provide an operational plan that describes in detail how the u3a presence at the event will be planned, managed, executed and followed up, including details of how the impact of attendance will be measured.

10 Years of Much Wenlock and District u3a

In late 2012, the late Alan Cavalier booked a hall to find out whether there was enough interest to



form a u₃a in the Wenlock area. In the beginning 72 people signed up as members, and 33 topics of interest were identified. Not all were viable, but by April 2013 there were 22 groups with a group leader. Eight of those early groups (Art and Watercolour, Creative Writing, Italian, Play Reading, Political Studies, Ukulele, Walking and Wine Tasting) continue to thrive. They also began a series of monthly talks.

Their membership has continued to grow, and by

March 2020 they had 270 members. Although numbers fell during Covid, they're now back to 250 members with 30 activity groups - 5 of them devoted to Italian! So, if you'd like to give it a go, remember *Tentar non Nuoce* (there's no harm in trying)

In April 2023 they celebrated their tenth anniversary with an afternoon tea in the Priory Hall where

it all began, organised by Jean Buswell a long standing Much Wenlock member. They were joined by Duncan White (Mayor of Much Wenlock), Allan Walmsley (Vice-Chair of u3a), Jean Jackson (W Midlands Regional Trustee), Glynis Nicholls, (Chair, Shropshire Area Network) and Mary Rogers (Chair of Wrekin u3a). In addition to the music provided by the Guitar Group, they were entertained by a table magician, Jack Dent and a good time was had by all.

10 Years of Kingswinford u3a's Ukulele Group

Kingswinford u3a was formed over 20 years ago and before lockdown had grown to close to 600 members with over 30 groups. But like many other u3a's it lost members during lockdown and is now slowly recovering. Today it has 25 active groups, meeting once or twice a month, mostly at Kingswinford Community Centre and holds regular events including





Coffee Mornings and Speaker Meetings, and a programme of Day Trips in summer months . The day trips have proved so popular that long gueues of members waiting to book places had formed at Coffee Mornings and a ticketing system had to be introduced to control the queues.



This year was the 10th anniversary of the formation of their Ukulele Group which has now grown to over 50 members. The anniversary was celebrated by a Ukulele Concert, held at the Community Centre. The event was a sell out with close to 130 people enjoying the music and an afternoon cream tea.

This was the first of a series of events that Tamworth are running this summer – they've already visited the RHS Bridgewater Garden in Salford, in June they're off to Babbacombe for 5 days, and there are more garden trips, the next one to the Dorothy Clive gardens in Shropshire. Perhaps due to all this, membership continues to grow rapidly, with 14 new joiners at the last meeting. **Congratulations, Tamworth!**

Classic Rock & Pop Music

Martin is a member of Lichfield u3a.

Why become u3a's Subject Advisor for Rock and Pop?

I love music, and must confess to being ex lead singer of a rock group (Leo Molgrape!) back in the 70s. When I first looked at u3a Groups, there were several for Opera and Classical Music, but not for modern music. it's less intimidating than Classical, but also has a wealth of information attached to it. For example, did you know that MTV originally didn't broadcast any "black" music? – and didn't until record companies threatened to withdraw their funds. There's a lot to discuss, and I've spoken to people from all over the country about how best to start up and run a Rock & Pop group in u3a.

What kind of help or advice can you give?

If people want to set up a Rock and Pop group, I ask them to consider:

Genre/theme – by taking turns to choose a topic, everyone can indulge their own particular interest. It works best to keep the overall theme as wide as possible. For Lichfield I chose the music of the 50s, 60s and 70s, which covered a wide range of possibilities. In reality, the list is almost endless: The Beatles, singer/songwriters, Christmas songs, Female/male vocalists, instrumentals, favourite albums.

Format of meeting – do you want your meetings to be educational or just a vehicle for playing music? For the former, you'll need a stream of people to host or 'give the talk'. I created a hybrid, where one member chooses the topic for the next meeting, and each member selects 2 songs within the topic and presents them with interesting snippets of information.

Technology – When people call me for advice, this is their No 1 question. Pre Covid my group used to find and play tracks using Spotify. Post Covid, I've played the choices using YouTube clips. This has worked very well, because video is something that reinforces & interprets modern music; you find that people have retrospectively added video to older tracks – there are plenty of Elvis videos for example.

Could you become a Subject Advisor? Yes, if you have a passion for a subject, that you'd like to share with others. To find out more, look at the list of u3a subject advisers on the national website and the Information pack that's there:


