The March meeting had a talk from Professor Michael Hicks, a national expert on the Wars of the Roses. He focussed on the disappearance of the two Princes in the Tower of London, relating events of 1483, especially the months between the accession of Richard III following the death of his elder brother Edward IV in the spring and the disappearance of his young sons, Edward V and Prince Richard later in the year. Michael is in no doubt that Richard III, the boys' uncle, was responsible for their killing, but this is unlikely to be proven. In April the speaker will be Dr Nicola Tallis talking about the history of the Crown Jewels.

The summer programme includes a guided walk by a local historian around Frome, a trip to Hampton Court and a walk led by an archaeologist along part of the Wansdyke.

A Water Rail was spotted in Bitham Brook, numerous Chiffchaffs were feeding on the insects around the Sewage Works and a Goosander was on Frogmore Pond. In February, nine of us visited Chew Reservoir. Our morning walk along the lake edge produced woodland species including Redpoll. After lunch and a hot drink we found wetland birds including displaying Goldeneyes.
