On 6^{th} June, Peter Bolton will give his second presentation on Bulgaria, which should include photos taken in May this year.


History Group St. John Ambulance Hall Thursdays (weekly). 2 – 4 pm

The History group sessions in March were concluded with further excellent meetings covering relatively obscure but turbulent periods in Russian and English history, while

Clair Stones provided us with an intriguing background analysis of the life of sailors in the heyday of the English navy through discussion of the many colloquial phrases that passed into everyday speech from naval usage. The Easter break is ushered in by the return of our friends from the Royal Armouries (Leeds) with their highly entertaining presentation on 'The Wild West'.

Following Easter our programme begins with a presentation on historical communities, including Wharram Percy near Malton, which disappeared from existence for a variety of reasons. Their stories illustrate factors that remain relevant to communities today.

Lecture Group St. John Ambulance Hall Tuesdays (3rd monthly). 10 – 12 noon

March saw the delivery of a particularly excellent presentation by Graeme Aldous on the student-led overland expedition from London to Singapore in the 1950's commissioned by the BBC. He graphically detailed the expedition itself and also told of how he retrieved archive material and created a documentary record of the achievements of the trip. His talk also gave telling insights into the personalities and interactions between the expeditioners. Graeme will be returning in November to recount the detail of the return journey.

In April, we're particularly pleased to welcome Gervase Phinn, to talk to us. He is an English author and educator. After a career as a teacher, he became a schools' inspector and, latterly, Visiting Professor of Education at the University of Teesside.

'The School Inspector Calls!'

A lively and personal presentation by the former school inspector and best-selling author – drawing on his wide-ranging experience of life in the Yorkshire Dales, and school life and visits.

Guidelines for submitting:

We suggest the dish could reflect either or both of the following themes:

- Sustainability and environmental impact. Consider agricultural and welfare best practices in your selected produce.
- Representative of the UK's partnership with the Commonwealth, celebrating the diversity of British cuisine in 2023.

The dish must be your own creation, an original recipe to the best of your knowledge. You should have made the dish yourself at least once, following your recipe. We recommend keeping the dish as simple as possible. All submissions must include at least one image of the dish; up to four images can be included. You may submit multiple recipes.

Please complete the form to submit your recipes

Dishes will be judged based on the recipe and images only - the judges will not make the dishes.

The deadline for submissions is 11 pm on Monday 10th April 2023

The winner will be announced ahead of the Coronation, and the winning recipe will be showcased on our website.

A shortlist of recipes will be sent to the Palace so they can see just how talented we are in the u3a movement.
