On a lighter note – we do have two new members in the band and we are looking forward to dusting off our Goth Week / Halloween set of songs as the nights start to draw in.




### **Recorder Group**

u3a community activity is great for those who can get out and about easily but if you struggle with mobility or other health related issues, are without transport, a full-time carer or have limited time to travel, then attending a group outside the home may not work for you. Good news, the national u3a has over 75 Interest Groups Online (IGO), offering a variety of peer led, online learning opportunities for subscribers and is hosting an online fair where people can try taster sessions for free. Between 2<sup>nd</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> October, a selection of group leaders will deliver taster sessions, from Laughter Yoga to British Cemeteries, giving prospective members a flavour of what they can enjoy if they decide to join. The taster sessions are open to everyone, including nonu3a members, so if you are interested make note of the date and share this with people you know who might be house bound or appreciate activities online. You can find out more and register for sessions by putting "u3a interest groups online" into your search engine. Anyone who is no longer in full-time work can come along to get a taste of the many opportunities IGO offers. You do not have to be a u3a member to enjoy the Fair. Visit the u3a interest groups online groups page to browse the 75 groups that run throughout the year, these include History, Language and Travel, Leisure, Literature, Music Science and Technology, The World Today and Visual Arts. As part of the u3a movement, members generously volunteer their time and share their knowledge, skills and experience with the members in their groups. Some groups are more interactive than others, with an expectation that all members take it in turns to present their knowledge. Learners can join IGO as a complementary service to their local in-person u3a membership or have a standalone membership of £12 a year.
