

RNLI: During last year's

programme Neil Williamson gave us a presentation on the history of Whitby lifeboats. There was a display at the end of that session and many members contributed to support of the work of the service. In recognition of that link and

support an opportunity will be provided at some point next year for the group to visit the lifeboat station, including the new boat that recently arrived in Whitby. Neil will also be back with us later this autumn to give a presentation on the history of Sandsend.

Discussion Group


