CHAIRMAN'S NEWS

Last week we had a visit from Alex Mason of the North East Ambulance NHS Foundation Trust who gave 25 of our members a two-hour session on CPR (Cardio Pulmonary Resuscitation) and use of defibrillators. Alex's obvious passion for saving lives was infectious and she soon had us practising CPR on manikins and asking lots of questions about the subject. We all came away feeling much more confident about handling a life saving situation and very likely will ask her to return to give further sessions. All participants made a £5 donation which covered the hire of the room from Linskill and enabled us to donate £50 to the trust.

Whilst the number of public access defibrillators in this area, as in all areas, has increased significantly over the last 10 years Alex was concerned that most people do not know how to use them which is very worrying noting that there are 30,000 cases of cardiac arrect outside hospitals or medical centres each year.

Alex brought up an important feature of mobile phones which is very important in emergencies. These phones, which now all have a locking feature, can be operated without opening the lock to access emergency services and emergency contact numbers you have entered into your phone under the designation "ICE" or "in case of emergencies'. It's a straightforward process to set up but varies on different phone types. If you take your phone to a phone shop someone there would be pleased to show you how to do this. Alternatively, there are u3a members here who would be very pleased help you.

Looking at membership, the very good news is that this continues to increase and currently stands at 372.
