# Bus Pass Group

The Bus Pass Group met last Tuesday for their second outing. After parking behind the Stanborough Centre, it was only a walk of a few

yards to the bus stop and the 321 bus. Our journey took us through Garston, Chiswell Green and on to St Albans city centre through thick fog.

We first visited the Clock Tower completed by 1405. It is the only surviving medieval town belfry in England and on some days of the year is open to the public to climb the 93 steps to the top.

The fog was lifting as we made our way to the Abbey and the place where Britain's first saint was buried over 1700 years ago. This is the 'Watching Loft' (right) where medieval monks watched over his shrine and

treasures. Built in 1406 it is the only surviving wooden loft used to spy on pilgrims to ensure nothing was stolen.



In 2020 the shrine of St Amphibalus (left) was restored after Henry VIII had it destroyed. The Royal School of Needlework embroidered the canopy. One of the stone masons restoring

the shrine during lockdown included a gargoyle wearing a mask!

## January General Meeting

Our speaker for January was Stuart Nagler and his topic was Policing, Crime and Justice.

Stuart's working life, apart from accountancy, included Special Constable, Chair of the Police Authority, working in the Police Commission and as a Magistrate for thirty years, for which he was unpaid.

He said we don't have as many police stations as formerly, but we have a station in each district manned by neighbourhood policing teams and we are soon to have a new police station.

He said there is a perception that we have fewer officers, but in fact we have more than we've ever had, with three hundred and fifty new officers, due to the recent government recruitment scheme. We see them less because the nature of crime is changing due to cyber-crime, scamming, hate crime etc. Herts is a low crime county with eighty thousand crimes per year.

Stuart told us that there are far more mobile criminals and that crime is often fuelled by wanting more material things and addiction.

He said that burglary is down, but theft of catalytic converters from cars, missing persons (a priority if the person is vulnerable), domestic abuse, sexting and stalking are increasing; the nature of crime is changing. He also reassured us that murders are rare, as is terrorism.

He felt, from his experience as a magistrate, that many leave court feeling they haven't received justice and that the system needs overhauling. Due to covid and other pressures a case can take three years to come to the Crown Court.

Magistrates Courts deal with ninety-five per cent of crime, and punishments include fines, community service and time in prison.

Stuart is a very charismatic speaker, interesting and is still serving his community, much of it for free, except for his time.
