#### Chair Annual Report 2021-2022

This is my Annual Report for the year 2021 to 2022, the year when Woodside u3a became 5 years old.

In a bid to regain some normality in our lives, we are holding our AGM in June as we did before the coronavirus pandemic. Last year it was held in October on Zoom. We have also reverted to our original membership fee of £24 per person as we are fully operating now. My report covers the period October 2021 to June 2022.

It was in October that we first held General Meetings at The Stanborough Centre in Garston. Our transfer to the venue was welcomed by members as the hall and kitchen facilities were very good and the parking was very easy.

As lockdown eased so the interest groups started to blossom again. With new groups such as Mexican Train and all the favourites from the Art group to the Woodside Walks group.

During this period we were in contact with National Office, East of England Region, Herts Network and the local Cluster Group. In the month prior to our AGM the Herts Network closed down as they were unable to form a new committee.

We stayed in contact with members via our monthly General Meetings, our monthly newsletter, our Facebook page and our website.

During the year we attended meetings and Zoom presentations, culminating with the East of England Regional Conference in Chelmsford, attended by Lesley Cummings, Joyce Gray, Jo Bromwich and myself.

Sadly, as coronavirus reared its head again with a new variant, we found it necessary to cancel the December 2021 meeting but we bounced back again in January. Thankfully we were able to hold our Annual Christmas Lunch before the new Omicron variant appeared.

Membership numbers reached 191 this year. Once face to face meetings resumed, we sustained an average of 70 members attending the monthly General Meetings. We were of course fully aware of social distancing, we continued to take temperatures at the door, and ensured the hall was well ventilated.

It was very pleasing to see the book stall appear again after retrieving the books from storage. Thank you to Carol and Ken Jones and Lesley Eldridge.

Speakers during the year included such varied topics as a representative from SERV Herts and Beds, who supply blood products and donor milk to neonatal units, firefighters who advised us of safety in the home in the event of a fire, the life of a store detective, singing with Ady and Jill, entertainment by The Shedettes, and a quiz presented by Glen Price. All being well we can have a Christmas meeting and celebration in 2022. We are celebrating the Queen's Platinum Jubilee in June with a special cake. At the end of June, and early July we will be participating in the Abbots Langley Festival.

Outings were not possible during most of this period but the Photographic group did manage to visit Rickmansworth Aquadrome. More outings are planned for the next year by the relevant groups.

The 2021/2022 Annual Financial Statement was prepared and approved by the Committee, and independently examined. Please address any questions you might have to our Treasurer Alison Theobald via the Woodside U3A email address.

I would like to thank Jo Bromwich, our editor for producing our monthly newsletter and our webmaster Andrew Cummings for organising and presenting our web page. Thank you also to Pam and Ken Cotton for administering the Woodside u3a Facebook page.

I thank my committee for their support. An especial thank you to Ken Appel for all his hard work. Ken has stood down from the Committee this year due to ill health. We have also welcomed Joyce Gray (Publicity), Louise Smith (Speakers Secretary) and Ken Cotton (general Committee member) to the Committee.

I thank the group leaders of the interest groups and the members, who have given support to myself and the Committee in another difficult year.

This year I have visited a number of interest groups as an observer and to meet members and intend to continue visiting groups next year. I am looking forward to my final year of office, and to the continuing success of Woodside u3a in the period 2022 to 2023.
