Notes: The maximum number of Committee members to be appointed at an AGM under the Constitution is 12 which is therefore the limit of nominations permitted from each individual proposer or seconder. This form can be used to nominate for any of the posts listed, up to that maximum.

Proposers or Seconders may not be existing members of the Committee and those nominated cannot be members of the Executive Committee of another U3A.

Those posts marked* are specified in the Constitution; all other appointments are referred to as Committee members but some have roles agreed when Woodside U3A was first established. Persons appointed to the Cttee become Charity Trustees and will have to sign a declaration form confirming they are not disqualified from being Trustees.

Nominations must be received by the (Membership) Secretary before the AGM and in the event of more valid nominations being received than vacancies an election will take place at the AGM. The Committee are able to fill any vacancies between AGM's and also have the discretion to co-opt up to two further members in addition to the 12 appointed at an AGM.

Argentina

Welcome everyone to our final virtual tour of the world. Today we are off to Argentina to experience all that their country offers, and as a mainly Spanish speaking country we are pleased that the Woodside Spanish (Group 1)are again accompanying us and will hopefully steer us through and ensure we get the best foods and drinks - and tourist experience of course!! Argentina produces several wines, their most famous being Malbec. Their favourite non alcoholic drink is a Yerba Mate - a herbal and caffeine infused tea, that is commonly shared amongst groups. Whilst I'll happily share my empanadas and provoleto with you all I think I'll have a vino grande! Sue, could you!

The Argentinian language

The Top 4 languages spoken in Argentina are Spanish, English, Portuguese and Italian but by far the greatest is Spanish with an estimated 40 million plus speaking this language. So what are the some of the key characteristics that make the Spanish spoken in Argentina different from that spoken in Spain.

Probably the two main differences are:-

- 1) Speed Argentinians send to speak a fair bit faster (shock horror from our Spanish Group !!)
- 2) Lack of the Lisp people who are familiar with Spanish from Spain will notice there is no lisp present in the Argentinian accent.

There are also a few more differences including the different use of verbs and the Italian inference in some words but will not elaborate on these as we have neither time or space at present.

Argentina is one of the largest

South American countries and the only country in the world to be named after a metal, in their case Argentum meaning silver, after settlers believed the country was full of it, although none has ever been found.

Argentina is mainly Spanish speaking and predominantly catholic, with its cultures arising from a blend of European, Indigenous and Latin American traditions. Some of their more famous names include Eva Peron, Maradona, Messi, Che Guevara and Pope Francis. They have great involvement with literature, cinema, drama, music and art. Their most famous dance is the Tango, described by many as 'making love in the vertical position', and was originally only danced in brothels and working class neighbourhoods, only becoming popular across all classes after Europe discovered it and it became more acceptable to dance so explicitly.

Argentinians are passionate about sport, football and polo being their main ones. The country is home to a vast natural wonderland, it's rich diversity ranging from sub tropical to glaciers, rich wetlands to deserts, lakes, forests and arid steppes. Their wildlife is equally spectacular ranging from penguins, flamingos, whales and giant anteaters. The national dish is Asados meaning barbecue meats that include steak, chorizo, sweetbreads and blood sausage - Argentinians are big meat eaters! Their national tree is the Ceibo, the Cockspur Coral tree, and it's stunning blood red flower

is their national flower. The tree forms part of their rich legends and folklore history; long

ago a young woman, Anahí, was captured by a Spanish conquistador and when trying to flee killed her captor. Once recaptured she was tied to a tree and burnt alive; later when her captures returned to remove her body they found in her place the beautiful Cockspur Coral tree. In 1942 this was declared their national flower, and the tree represents bravery and strength in the face of suffering, and can be found growing throughout the country.

Argentina from Barbara E

Incredibly Argentine women go through the highest number of plastic surgeries - per person - in the world. Argentina is perhaps one of the world's most looks-conscious countries. (sadly also more than 30% of its women undergo some form of eating disorder).

Argentina was the first country to use fingerprinting as a method of identification. In 1892, the small Argentinian town of Necochea in the Province of Buenos Aires, was rocked by the gruesome stabbing of two children. With no witnesses to the crime, local police were unable to tie the murder to any particular suspect. Utilizing a bloody fingerprint left on a door handle, a local detective discovered the murderer to be the kids' mother (who not long after, eventually confessed to the crime.)

As well as being radio pioneers, Argentinians also created the first animated feature films! The world's first full length cartoon was made and released in Argentina, by a man named Quirino Cristiani in 1917. And it is said he was an inspiration to Walt Disney, who during his trip to Argentina visited Quirino's studio in the outskirts of Buenos Aires.
