A LETTER TO ALL CHAIRS FOR CIRCULATION TO YOUR COMMITTEES AND MEMBERS

Happy New Year to all u3a members in our region - let's look forward to a busy and fun 2023! I attach details of our latest regional team for your information. We are all ready to support, advise and assist you and your members, should you need us.

2022 has been an interesting, if somewhat difficult, year. The majority of our region's u3as have successfully recovered their membership numbers following covid and many have indeed run very successful recruitment events resulting in increased membership numbers. Well done to all! If, however, you need any help with recruitment issues please do not hesitate to contact us - we are here to help. Most groups are back up and running and providing learning and social activities to everyone.

The regional presentations have proved very popular, we often have more attendees from the East of England than others with a national audience. We have joined together as a region to support each other and now welcome the opportunity to meet up with other regular attendees. Your support is greatly appreciated. Our Walking Group Project for the 40th Anniversary has proved outstandingly popular. We have now produced an 85 page booklet illustrating walks across our region during September 2022. The response received has been exceptional. Copies of the booklet have already been emailed to all group leaders who participated and they have been offered hard copies if they wish to receive them. Within the next week all chairs will receive an online copy to make available to everyone and we shall be happy to provide hard copies at no cost to you if requested. A truly outstanding result and something we hopefully shall repeat for other groups.

In 2023 the team will be working on setting up informal networks for each of our counties. Herts Network is about to reconvene, the first steps for Essex will take place in January and events will be arranged for Cambridgeshire, Bedfordshire, Norfolk and Suffolk in the early part of the year. The plan is to set up these informal gatherings with no elected officers and no membership fees, a grouping of u3as interested in sharing their experiences with others. We have been asked to arrange the occasional face to face meeting with a request to break these down into smaller areas to avoid long journeys. This we are more than happy to encourage but will need u3as to step forward and help with locating venues, etc. It does seem a good idea, bearing in mind environmental and other issues we are all facing now.

Following the agm, the Trust have decided to increase communications and consultations with the membership to ensure that all members are fully represented in future plans. You will be invited to join members of the board and staff online to voice your opinions on proposals put forward. May I encourage you to take part to ensure that the views of your members are represented. The u3a movement belongs to each and every one of you and your input is important. My main objective as a trustee is to support you and your members.

Third Age Matters Magazine

On 10th January I attended a zoom meeting organised by the Eastern Region about the Third Age Matters Magazine. It included a 45 minute presentation by Joanne Smith, the magazine's editor.

She gave us a little information into her background as a journalist and a potted history of the magazine. She was put in post in 2019, charged with giving the magazine a new look with an emphasis on highlighting u3as and member achievements and successes. You may have noticed that the magazine now has a star feature, bigger photos and new regular features like recipes, technology, walking and travel etc.

The magazine has 84 pages and 45% of it is advertising because the advertising has to cover the production costs. It cannot make a loss. There are currently 5 issues which are delivered in February, April, June, September, and November. The cost is currently £3.35 for 5 issues but this will increase to £3.60 in April, a rise of approximately 7% or 5p a copy. This is to cover the increase in distribution costs, although someone did query why it had been increased by 7% when postage costs had only gone up by 3%!! The cost of the magazine is included in your membership subscription. It was suggested that the magazine went down to 4 copies per year to reduce costs which may be considered in the future.

Joanne welcomes articles from u3a members and says that they usually have more than they need so if you are thinking of submitting an article Joanne needs to know about big, unusual inspiring events before they happen (so that she can organise a professional photographer if necessary). If you include photos they must be in a large or actual size and send more than is needed so she has a choice. Be concise. A full page article is only 500 words and a half page is 250. You can send your articles to joanne.smith@u3a.org.uk.
