The Lunch Group met for lunch at West Herts College where the students provided an excellent three course meal for just £.10.



February General Meeting

Our speaker for February was Joanna Bogel and her topic was Britain's Traditional Feasts And Seasons. Joanna chose to speak about Spring but she has other talks for Summer, Autumn and Winter.

Joanna explained that we are in danger of losing sight of this heritage as time progresses and our way of living changes. Feast days are a community thing, many marked by Christian and Jewish

traditions, and it is natural to mark the changing seasons. It is about life and death.



She said the word shrove, is derived from being shriven of sins; the confession and forgiveness of them. Pancakes are tossed three times representing the Father, Son and Holy Ghost. There is a significance to the number forty - Lent is forty days and the money saved should be given to the poor. It was traditionally a time of reflection.

Joanna said that ashes distributed on Ash Wednesday were traditionally made using burnt palms from Palm Sunday of the year before. No Sundays are counted in the forty days of Lent and neither is Mother's Day, making a sort of mid Lent break and lengthening it to forty-six days.

Maundy Thursday was a time when the monarch (often with a posy of flowers under the nose) washed the feet of twelve men, as Jesus did the apostles. Maundy Money was given as alms to the poor, although it's more symbolic now.

I was surprised to hear that the treat of Easter Eggs are given on Easter Sunday because hens lay fewer eggs in Winter and the few there were preserved in water glass. The eggs represent new life.

Popular simnel cake served at Easter, decorated with marzipan balls, represents the twelve apostles and simnel means similar, identical grains of something. Lamb often eaten on Easter Sunday represents the Lamb of God.
