Our speaker for July was Liz Arendt talking about Hearing Dogs for Deaf People, assisted by Suz Hickson and Rufus the dog.

Liz explained how much we take for granted that other people can hear us and that being deaf is not the same as needing hearing aids.

It costs £45,000 to train a dog and unsuccessful dogs go as companions, to mountain rescue or for police work. Money for training is raised by volunteers at events such as Summer Fayres.

Rufus demonstrated to us how he alerts Liz by nudging her with his nose and leading her to the sound.


This could be the doorbell, alarm clock or 'phone ringing and he lays down in front of her to signal danger. Rufus was well rewarded for his efforts with treats!.

Very few hearing dogs are currently available for many people who require them. They provide companionship as well as working until they are retired at around eleven years old.

We had a very informative and entertaining morning with Liz, Suz and Rufus with many of our members staying behind afterwards to pat and stroke Rufus.

Also her collection tin for personal donation as our members left raised a further £132.46. Our u3a donation was also matched by an anonymous donor! Absolutely great!



Bus Pass Group

On Friday August 11th 2023 three of us set off on the 724 Bus Route from the former Garston Garage Bus Stop to Hatfield House. Although the forecast had been for rain that day the sun shape with the day becoming years.

the weather forecast had been for rain that day the sun shone with the day becoming very warm with no rain.

The 724-bus route is a 'limited stop' service which enabled us to pass through Chiswell Green, St. Albans, Hatfield Town Centre before arriving at Hatfield Railway Station after a forty-minute journey. The entrance to the grounds of Hatfield House, and subsequently the actual House, is directly opposite the railway station. We proceeded up the long drive to the House, and thankfully on our right was a very pleasant



restaurant where we stopped and rested whilst having some refreshments/lunch. We then completed the walk up to the Hatfield House which is the home of the Marquis and Marchioness of Salisbury.

As you can image the House is full of artifacts and painted pictures of numerous members of the Cecil family which have been collected over the centuries the significance of which were explained to us by various very knowledgeable Guides who were on hand to explain the relevance of each item. One of the highlights was a portrait of Queen Elizabeth 1 which showed the Queen dressed in a garment which had illustrations of 'ears' and 'eyes' all over the gown. This signified that the Queen had spies all over her realm 'listening and seeing' what was going on in her realm 'presumably finding out who was plotting against her' and those spies would report back to the Queen who would take the appropriate action. We were also able to visit the Chapel, which is within the House, with its stained-glass windows, font and very old wooden pews.

Hatfield House is set in many acres of beautiful grounds and gardens which, sadly, we did not have time to explore.

As we left the House, we were able to have a lift back to the entrance by a Golf Buggy which was very welcome.

The Bus Pass Group will be arranging another bus trip, probably during the autumn school half term holidays so watch out for further news in the Woodside U3A magazine.
