REMARKS FROM A COMMITTEE MEMBER (EX-CHAIR)

Normally, these notes would have been produced by the Chair of Woodspring u3a to reflect some of the more notable events that our u3a has achieved since the last report. However, we are currently running without a Chair and will continue to do so until our Annual General Meeting which is presently scheduled for 23 May next year. At that event you will have the opportunity to elect a new Chair or, because our rules have enforced a one-year interregnum on me, you may be stuck with my return as Chair for up to five more years! Whilst I am happy to return for a short period, I would urge each of you to consider whether a further five years of me is to the benefit of our u3a. Of course, I'm very happy to continue in my other roles of Speaker Secretary, Beacon Administrator and even as the Woodspring Representative at the Northern Somerset Association of U3A's (NSA). But change is often good, and I can think of nothing more beneficial than bringing in a new Chair who is able and willing to give a new impetus to the direction and work of your Committee. Have you ever thought that we should be moving in a different direction or perhaps shaping a long-term plan for improvement? Do you have any ideas that you think could help your Committee to deliver a better product? You may be just the person best fitted to develop these types of ideas and I would urge you to put your name forward firstly to join the Committee and, later, as a candidate for a specific role when you're happy to do so.

I ought to say something about what the Committee has been doing on your behalf.

- 1. Since last autumn we have been operating a separate seating area at our monthly meetings for those who wish to observe social distancing and continue with wearing masks. However, the demand is now fading and even those opting to use this seating area either have to be reminded of the restrictions or are simply ignoring them. Now there is no legal imperative for public mask wearing or providing spaced-out seating so the last occasion this was done was 25 Oct. 2022. Thereafter the chairs will be set out in the normal manner. Of course, if either the demand for returning to the provision of social distancing or a new covid outbreaks forces us to revert then that is what we will do.
- 2.Many of you will have noticed a number of new Interest Groups have been formed and these were clearly needed as the take up has been most gratifying. It is equally clear that the demand to join existing Interest Groups exceeds their ability to cope with additional members and the answer is surely to form satellite groups operating in the same subject area but at a different location and run by a different Group Leader. If you are currently waiting for a place in one of our Interest Groups why don't you consider starting your own satellite Group.
- 3. My aim for 2022/23 was to get Woodspring u3a registered with the Charities Commission but, to do so, we need to have a full set of Committee Officers and as we currently run without a Chair that is a little difficult. Hopefully, this can proceed after our AGM next year and would allow us to benefit from tax refunds.
- 4.This year, the NSA's general knowledge quiz took place in Wells. Seven teams took part including two teams from Woodspring one of which came equal first but then lost the tie-break to finish second.
- 5.We have managed to run a full speaker programme for this year apart from one month when a predicted heatwave caused us to cancel, and a couple of late changes were made due to illness. I'm happy to say that the speakers we missed have either since presented to you or are scheduled for 2023. A full programme of 11 speakers for 2023 is being filled but do please send me details of any speaker you've heard who would provide an interesting talk to our members.
