# Membership news

Our numbers continue to increase, with over 490 members in Woodspring u3a now. Everyone's annual membership will be due for renewal on 1<sup>st</sup> April 2024, and we are taking the opportunity to review our fees. Rest assured, the annual fee will remain the same for most people. Out of the £13 fee you pay we have to send £5 per member to our umbrella organization (the national u3a) who provide administrative systems (such as our email and membership records package, a web-based database), insurance, subject advisors, and a range of online opportunities such as cryptic crossword courses, competitions, and shopping discounts. We send another £3.60 per member for you to receive the national Third Age Matters magazine (TAM) 5 times a year in the post. Many members enjoy the TAM articles and letters and find the advertisements useful, but others are not so keen on receiving this publication, or prefer to read the free online version on the national u3a website. The Committee has therefore decided to offer a reduced fee membership option for those who do **not** wish to receive the TAM magazines by post. The 2024-2025 fees will be:


Individual member, including the TAM magazine =  $\pounds$ 13 Joint members (two people at same address), including shared TAM magazine =  $\pounds$ 22.40 in total Individual member, no TAM magazine =  $\pounds$ 9.40 per person Joint members (two people at same address), no TAM magazine =  $\pounds$ 9.40 per person

#### Pickleball

I first started playing Pickleball about 18 months ago when injury prevented me from playing tennis. It's one of the fastest growing sports in the world even attracting many of the older elite Wimbledon stars, Andre Agassi, Maria Sharapova, John McEnroe to name a few. Just to be clear - I was NEVER good at the tennis, I just enjoyed playing!!

Pickleball is a cross between Tennis, Table Tennis and Badminton – the ball is hit over a net the same height as a tennis net, – the 'bat' or paddle is larger version of a table tennis bat and it's played on a badminton sized court. We play with a pickleball which is plastic, similar size to a tennis ball with holes in it – like the ones we used to play with at school.

Since our group started with 6 or 8 interested people last April, the group has grown to 32 members, many of whom have joined our U3A especially so they can play! We are a very mixed group, from the more relaxed to a few serious competitive players.

Each session begins with a warm-up then games are played, and we move round enabling us to play with and against different people. If we have too many people for the number of courts on Friday, there is opportunity for some people to play at another time.

We are also a very sociable group. Some people have a coffee after playing, others (those who are not able to play that week) meet up and have a coffee whilst others play. We've had 'socials,' and our Christmas meal together was very entertaining Having a lot of members will ensure that we can keep going when many people are on holiday.
