A GUIDE TO WOOLER u3a

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What we do

Welcome to Wooler u3a. We are glad you are joining us and we hope you find the information in this short booklet useful. If there is anything else you would like to know, please ask. Contact numbers of Committee members and group leaders are listed below.

There is a regular meeting on the second Monday of the month in order to keep in touch, hear about forthcoming events and, on alternate months, listen to an interesting speaker. (Look out for clashes with Bank Holidays when the date can change). These meetings are held at the Cheviot Centre.

Wooler u3a currently has a number of groups that meet regularly, as well as occasional events and excursions. The charge for transport, tickets, etc. is payable on booking.

The monthly and weekly groups meet at various times and in various venues. They cover many interests and enable members to share their knowledge, skills, and expertise in the friendly and informal way that is unique to the u3a. Details about our current groups are set out in the following pages.

If you have an interest that you are willing to share with others or there is a topic in which you are interested which our current groups do not cover, talk to one of our committee members about it: see pages 3 and 4 for contact details.

It only takes one or two interested people to get a group going and you do not have to be a specialist in the subject; just interested and enthusiastic. We all learn from one another and there are resources available from u3a National Resource Centre to support groups.

There is a modest annual subscription, part of which goes to The Third Age Trust that supports all u3a groups by providing advice, resources, and events. The rest is used to fund the group's activities; e.g. money for speakers, transport, photocopying, etc. In addition, those attending are asked for a nominal payment for room hire and refreshments, usually about £2 per meeting. However, please do not think that you have to commit to a group without first trying it. You can try a couple of meetings with any group before paying the annual subscription.

PRINCIPLES OF THE u3a MOVEMENT

The u3a movement is non-religious and non-political and has three main principles:

The third age principle.

Membership of the u3a is open to everyone not in full time employment., which is defined not by a particular age but by a period in life in which full-time employment has ceased.

Members promote the value of lifelong learning and the positive social interaction

Members should do all they can to ensure that people wanting to join a u3a can do so.

The self-help learning principle.

Members form interest groups covering as wide a range of topics and activities as they desire – by the members for the members.

No qualifications are sought or offered. Learning is for its own sake, with enjoyment being the prime motive, not qualifications or awards.

There is no distinction between Group Leaders, Committee Members and members. We are all members of u3a.

The mutual aid principle.

Each u3a is a mutual aid organisation, operationally independent but a member of The Third Age Trust, which requires adherence to the guiding principles of the u3amovement.

No payments are made to members for services rendered to any u3a.

Each u3a is self-funded with membership subscriptions and costs kept as low as possible.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF MEMBERSHIP

All members must:

- Abide by the Principles of the u3a movement.
- Always act in the best interests of the u3a and never do anything to bring the u3a into disrepute.
- Abide by the terms and conditions of the constitution.
- Treat fellow members with respect and courtesy at all times.
- Comply with and support the decisions of the elected committee.
- Advise the Committee of any change in their personal details.
