Sir Edward Elgar was born at the Firs in Lower Broadheath, and remained devoted to this area throughout his celebrated career. In fact, the second of the only two homes he owned was in Rainbow Hill, which is where he died. He was a fascinating man, and something of an enigma even to those who knew him well. Our speaker is Sam Dobson of the Elgar Society who will tell the



story of Sir Edward with plenty of music and illustrations. Sam has been connected with the Leicester Symphony Orchestra for many years. He is a great admirer of Edward Elgar, as a man who rose from relative obscurity to the top of his profession, becoming a national hero with an international following.

Revealing Our History

This proactive group covers a wide range of history, county wide, locally and beyond. It developed from one of the original Local History Groups (LH4) in 2021 after lockdown, when the group had been meeting on Zoom. We were joined by some members from LH2 and LH3. Attendance to all history groups had dropped, especially LH4, which had members from all over the city. The original venue was too large and there seemed little demand for 4 groups covering the same local history of Worcester city.

After helping Third Age Trust with a National History Group during 2020–22 when I put together the history of England from 6000BC using BBC history magazines at home, with help from many of the members online, it seemed an ideal opportunity to expand our knowledge.

So, with just 15 members, we met first at Norton in September 2021. Our subjects have included the history of local villages, towns, industry, and landowners, together with interesting presentations as varied as History of Quakers, Puritans, Jesuits and Huguenots presented by members. There have been guest Speakers on "Lord Austin and the Longbridge Story"," Worcester Farmstead Project" "Demise of Stately Homes" and others. We also have visits to local Museums such as Stourbridge Glass and Worcester Collections at Hartlebury.



Since September 2022 we have been meeting in an excellently equipped room in **the Hive** close to the Bus Station.
