


A Happy New Year to all our Members

Newsletter Editor

It is my turn to tell you a bit about my role as Newsletter Editor, which ends in March. Please consider if you might enjoy any of the Committee positions that are up for renewal – Chair, Groups' Coordinator and Newsletter Editor. It will be difficult to run our u3a if these posts don't get filled.

'I think this role is slightly different from any others on the Executive Committee. There are rules to be followed, of course. u3a brand guidelines and general data protection and copyright regulations have to be adhered to, but apart from that, style and content are pretty much up to you. I have a very chatty style – the word 'super' probably gets overused, and I like to include lots of photos, but the incoming newsletter editor can choose their own style.

Providing 'what's happening in Worcester u3a' is always included and if something is happening within the Third Age Trust that is relevant this should be mentioned, but the rest is very much left to your discretion.

It is difficult to put a time estimate on how long I spend writing the newsletter. As soon as the previous newsletter has been sent out (1st of every month) I spend an evening preparing for the next, including all the forthcoming events that I know about. When I receive an email from members, or the Committee, I copy it into my draft to ensure nothing is forgotten. Any information is supposed to be received by the 16th of each month. This doesn't always happen, and some last-minute items can come through in the days before the newsletter goes to committee members for approval. The deadline is to allow enough time for the printed copies to be posted to arrive by the beginning of the month.

You have to be confident in the use of Microsoft Word (other packages are available) and it helps to be a proficient typist, but other than that, provided the guidelines are followed, and advice is sought when you are unsure if the content should be used, you pretty much have free reign to set out your style.'
