A Small Change to Gift Aid

There is going to be a small change to the wording of the Gift Aid declaration – you do not need to do anything and if you have already completed a Gift Aid declaration, this still applies. The change is to show that from your subscription, £12 goes to running our u3a and only this amount of the subscription fee qualifies for Gift Aid. The balance of your subscription goes towards the costs of running interest groups.

The change is a result of clarification received from the Third Age Trust and will unfortunately, reduce the amount of income that we receive from Gift Aid.

Whilst we do not expect the change to impact on the wide range of interest groups or the events programme available to members, the final position will not be clear until discussions with HMRC have been completed.

If you pay tax and have not completed a Gift Aid declaration, please do so. We receive 25p in Gift Aid for every £1 of eligible income and this contributes significantly to our income. You can make a Gift Aid declaration:

We also discussed the issue of, and rules for passports, now that we no longer belong to the EU. We are now classed as "third country nationals". If you are a non-EU wishing to visit or travel within the EU, you will need a passport:

- valid for at least 3 months after the date you intend to leave the EU country you are visiting
- which was issued within the previous 10 years
